Flooding

- Evacuate the area (without risking yourselves!)

If the alleged suspect is out of control - local law enforcement should be contacted by Site Lead to help contain the situation. We do not have the mandate to physically restrain people. Friends of the Alleged suspect may do so at their own volition and risk, but never upon the instruction of Nowhere crew.

Everyone will cooperate fully with local law enforcement at all times. Only Site Lead and MSL will interact with local law enforcement in criminal cases. Same-gendered No-Mads should stay with the victim(s) whenever possible.

Radio Guide

Radios are serious business. They may be small, but all too often they can give us far too big a sensation of power or authority. It is also easy to get carried away and forget that our radios are our work tools, not our personal 'inside joke' transmitters.

Before we get into the how to use them, here are a few quick reminders of how not to use the radios

Rules for the radio

- 1. Don't clog up the airwaves. Someone in trouble or with a real problem may be trying to get through!
- 2. Don't interrupt other people on the radio unless it's an emergency. Listen for 5 seconds to make sure no one is speaking before you jump in and transmit.
- 3. Don't forget to be professional! Everyone can hear the radios, and what you say on them.
- 4. Don't invade chill spaces and grab attention with your radio. Radios can be really annoying, and sometimes even threatening, to those who are on a different wavelength, so to speak.
- 5. Don't let the radio go to your head.
- 6. Don't get carried away using the radios.
- 7. Don't sit on your radio no 'butt calls' please!

Using your radio

- 1. Be careful how close your mouth is to the mic. Too close and you will sound garbled. Too far and you will not be heard.
- 2. You do not need to SHOUT! Speak in your normal voice.
- 3. Don't stay in loud or crowded places for too long you might not hear us if we are trying to call you.
- 4. Don't accidentally sit on your radio 'butt calls' jam up the airwaves. Not to mention the private (or so you thought!) conversations that may be captured as a result!
- 5. Listen before you speak. Listen for 5 seconds before you jump in and start transmitting something, to make sure you're not interrupting anyone!

Radio lingo

ALLCOM: Attention, everyone. Usually repeated twice: "AllCom, AllCom: Can anyone see Site Lead?"

BREAK: Everyone cease transmissions and listen. Used in extreme emergency only. Typically said three times to insure everyone is paying attention:

"Break. Break. Break: Swarm of killer bees headed our way. Get everyone to take cover as soon as possible."

OFFCOM: I am turning off the radio and not available.

ONCOM: I am available on channel / back on channel

OVER: I'm done talking and waiting for you to reply. "Where was the location of that UFO again, over?"

OUT: I'm done talking and you don't need to reply/ the conversation is over. "Thanks Malfare - I figured out the location and I'll be on scene shortly, out."

STANDBY: Hang on while we handle your request. Monitor the channel and wait for response.

COPY THAT: Got it. Understood
